# Be a community sharps.... Safety Stickler

## What are community sharps?

Many people rely on using needles and syringes to maintain their own health or that of a family member. Injecting equipment is also used by injecting drug users, and for animal healthcare by pet and livestock owners.

Community sharps is the name used to describe needles, syringes, lancets and similar equipment resulting from these activities.

## Disposal of community sharps

Community sharps should always be kept secure and separate from other wastes.

Because of the high risk of injury to workers and other community members they should never be disposed of:

- X in household waste or recycling bins (plastic syringes are NOT recyclable)
- x in public litter bins
- by flushing down toilets or drains
- by discarding into the environment.

## Use community sharps bins for the correct disposal of your sharps.

- Use a yellow sharps container or other appropriate puncture resistant container (eg heavy duty plastic, NOT glass)
- Store the container out of reach of children
- Seal the lid of the container when 3/4 full and dispose of container at one of the community sharps disposal facilities listed in this brochure.



**Lake Macquarie City Council** community sharps bins are available for use

24 hours a day 7 days a week\* Disposal is free of charge.

## If you find injecting equipment

While the risk of acquiring a serious infection as a result of an accidental injury from a community sharp is extremely low, the anxiety resulting from such an injury can be significant.
